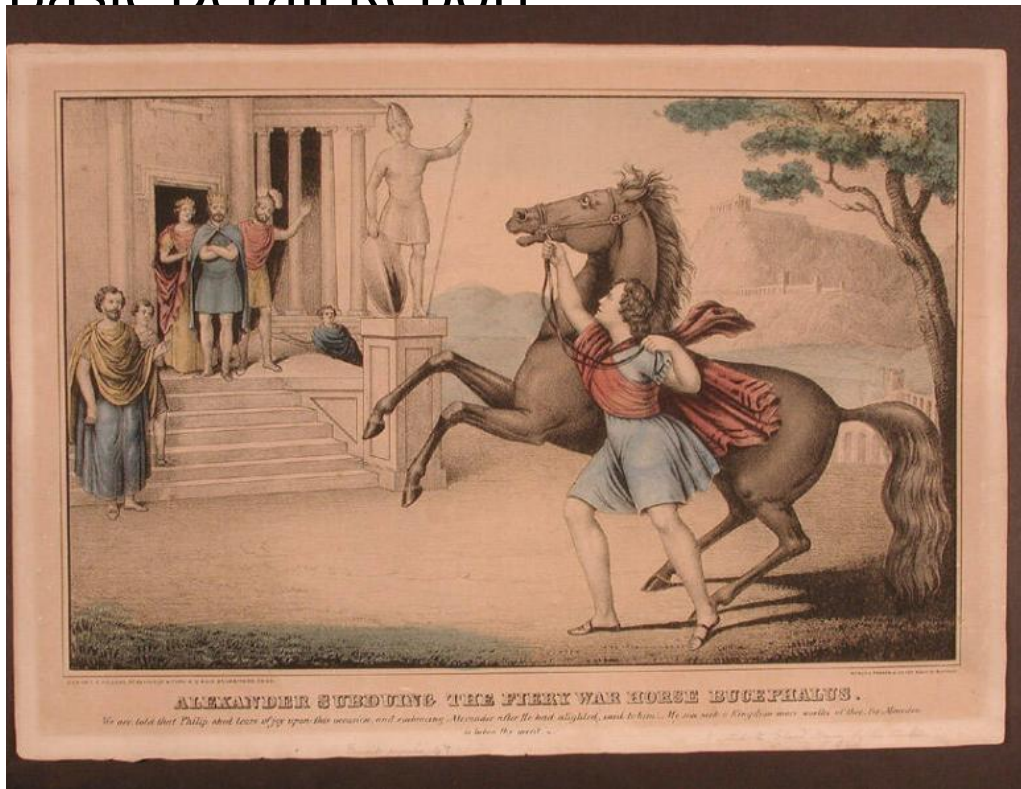


# Basic Detail Report

Description A scene from ancient history showing Alexander the Great holding the bridle of a rearing black horse. King Phillip, Alexander's father, looks on from the porch of a stone building with an Ionic colonnade. A statue of a warrior holding a spear and a shield is nearby. The king wears a gold crown on his head and is attended by his queen and a soldier with a plumed helmet. Other onlookers include a bearded man and a boy. A temple is on an acropolis in the background. Fortifications are near the base of the hill.
