Title Infant's Dress

Date 1807; remade about 1840-1850

Primary Maker Francis Newman Holley

Medium Hand-stitched cotton

Description Infant's dress of white cotton, with a wide, square neckline and short, straight sleeves. The bodice is cut as a long rectangle, with the narrow

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ends folded to the center back to create the opening. Narrow shoulder straps

connect the front and back. A drawstring is run across the top of the bodice,

front and back. The armhole seam is piped, which is common to mid-century

construction, but not early nineteenth-century construction. The plain, straight

sleeves once had ruffles around the openings, as indicated by old needle holes.

Needle holes and fold lines also indicate that each sleeve had a tuck mid-way

around it. The bodice has been lengthened and a waistband with casings for five

drawstrings added. The skirt is gathered along the bottom of the waistband. A 4

1/2-inch-wide tuck is taken around the skirt. The center back opening is thirteen

inches long.
