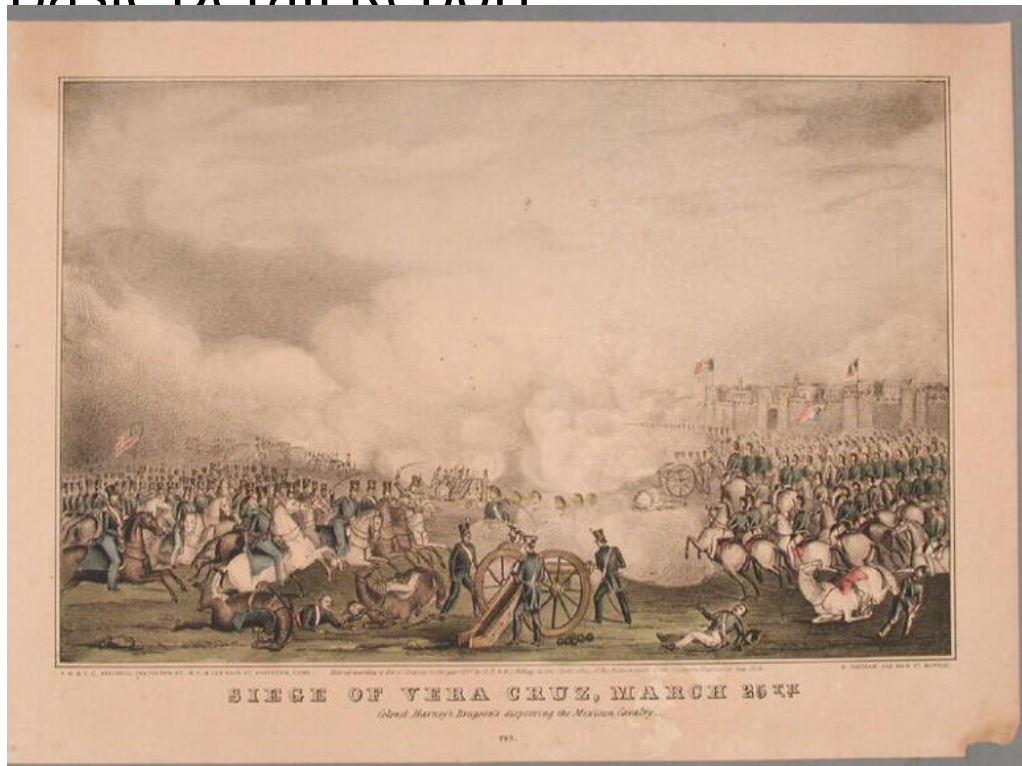


# Basic Detail Report



**Title** Siege of Vera Cruz, March 25th.

**Date** 1847

**Primary Maker** E.B. & E.C. Kellogg

**Medium** Lithography; printer's ink and watercolor on wove paper
