## Title Platter

Date late 18th-early 19th century

Primary Maker Unknown

Medium Drape-molded Chinese export porcelain with underglaze cobalt blue decoration

Description Oval, Chinese export porcelain platter with hand-painted underglaze cobalt blue decoration showing a Chinese landscape; the platter is a type of Chinese export porcelain known as Nankingware. The landscape consists of a tree and Chinese structure to the right. A river flows through the landscape, with a bridge in the foreground and hills, trees, and houses in the distance. There are two figures in the scene, one on the bridge and another on a boat that floats on the river. The landscape is surrounded by a series of borders.
