## Title Platter

Medium Drape-molded Chinese export porcelain with underglaze cobalt blue decoration

Description Rectangular, Chinese export porcelain platter with hand-painted underglaze cobalt blue decoration showing a Chinese landscape; the platter is a type of Chinese export porcelain known as Cantonware. The central Chinese landscape consists of a willow tree with a Chinese structure to the right. A Chinese junk floats on a river that runs through the landscape, with a bridge in the foreground and mountains, trees, and houses in the background. The central landscape is surrounded by a series of borders. First, there is a band of

blue with darker blue lines creating a diamond pattern inside. This border is

surrounded by a field of white and then a "Canton" border, consisting of a

scalloped line with parallel lines of hatching running inside. The "Canton"

border is surrounded by another band of blue with darker lines creating stars

inside. Imperfections in the porcelain appear as black dots on the surface of the

platter.
