

Title Dish

Date late 19th-early 20th century

Primary Maker Newton & Lincoln

Medium Cast porcelain with overglaze gilding and black enamel decoration

Description Small, porcelain dish in the shape of a veined leaf; the stem and

edges of the leaf are curled up to create a relatively deep space. The edges of the

dish are gilded, and there is an oval, black enamel scene printed in the center of

the dish. The scene is titled below, "SECOND CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH,

WINSTED, CONN." It shows a Romanesque-style stone building with a tall tower,

arched doorways, and hipped rooflines. There is a street and sidewalk in front of
the building and trees on either side. Much of the gilding has worn off of the

edges of the dish.
