Medium Mechanically-molded ironstone with underglaze purple decoration

Description Round ironstone plate with an undulating rim and underglaze

plate. The pattern shows two individuals in a sailboat on a river. There are trees

of mountains is visible in the far distance. The pattern is surrounded by a border at the rim, which has groups of large flowers surrounded by smaller white flowers superimposed on a field of light purple. A line of purple with white circles is found at the outer edge of the rim. There is some crazing at the rim, especially on the edge to the right of the pattern. Nearby there is a meandering crack in the rim. Yellow residue from tape is adhered to the back of the rim. Dimensions Primary Dimensions (diameter): 10 3/8in. (26.4cm)
