An arched building with a sculpture on the frieze is on the bank to the left, while a domed building with sculpture on the frieze is located in the right distance.

Trees and flowers have grown up in the land around the structures. The

landscape is surrounded by a delicate border consisting of a scalloped line and

flowers. A border of small scrolls and large flowers covers the rim and spills

down onto the plate. There is light crazing and dirt accumulation throughout the

surface of the plate.
