

## Title Soup Plate or Dish

Date 1831-1835

Medium Mechanically-molded ironstone with underglaze purple decoration

Description Round ironstone soup plate or dish with an undulating rim and

underglaze transfer-printed pattern and border in purple, or mulberry. The soup

plate/dish is relatively shallow and has a wide rim. The circular pattern, titled,

"Hartford Connecticut" on the bottom, is printed in the center. The pattern

shows two individuals in a sailboat on a river. There are trees on the left, and a

town is visible in the distance. In the town, three steeples rise above many

buildings, and one bilding with a circular cupula is visible. A range of mountains is visible in the far distance. The pattern is surrounded by a border at the rim, which has groups of large flowers surrounded by smaller white flowers superimposed on a field of light purple. A line of purple with white circles is found at the outer edge of the rim. There is crazing and yellow discoloration over all the surfaces of the soup plate/dish. A significant amount of dirt has adhered to the foot.
