## Title Teapot

Date late 19th-early 20th century

Primary Maker Unknown

Medium Mold-formed earthenware with a translucent brown glaze

Description Ten-sided earthenware teapot with lid, with a translucent brown glaze, a type of ceramic known as Rockingham ware. The teapot (.a) is decorated on each side with the same relief molded scene showing a woman in a robe, holding a ceramic jug, standing next to a low stone well. The teapot has a spout with floral relief decorations and a handle with abstract geometric relief decoration. The domed lid (.b) has floral relief decorations and a small circular

finial. The lid has an oval cut-out to allow the lid to be removed from below the

protruding devices that keep the lid on while pouring. There is light crazing over

all the surfaces of the teapot, and four chips in the rim of the lid.
