## **Title Jar or Crock**

Date late 18th-mid 19th century

Primary Maker Unknown

Medium Wheel-thrown redware with a lead glaze and manganese black  
decoration

# Basic Detail Report

Description Cylindrical redware jar or crock with a clear lead glaze and several

patches of manganese black decoration. The jar/crock has a flat bottom and

cylindrical sides that rise to form a plain, standing rim. There is a raised line

about an inch and a half below the rim. Two pulled lug handles are pressed

against the jar/crock along their full length, attaching completely over the raised

line of ceramic. The lead glaze is applied to the interior and much of the exterior;

the bottom half-inch of the sides of the jar/crock is left unglazed. There is

crazing over all the glazed surfaces of the jar/crock and several small chips in the

rim. Small flakes of glaze have chipped off the handles, revealing the ceramic

below. There are light scratches over the exterior of the jar/crock. One of the

handles has an old crack running completely through the redware. There is a

large crack around one side of the bottom that extends upwards on the side of

the jar/crock.
