

Title Sampler

Date mid 19th century

Primary Maker Mary Bartlett Sexton

Medium Embroidery; wool on a plain-woven cotton ground

Description Marking sampler worked in dark green, light green, magenta, dark pink, and medium brown, silk and wool threads on a plain-woven cotton ground in cross stitch (over two threads). The sampler is rectangular, oriented horizontally. It is laid out with five rows of three alphabets and the numbers 1 through 9. Certain lines of alphabets and numbers are separated by various narrow meandering borders. There is a narrow three-sided border on the top and the side edges; there is no border on the bottom edge. The sampler has a 2 /8-inch double-turned hem on the top and both side edges, and a selvedge on the bottom edge. The sampler is not framed. Letters and Numbers: There are

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three alphabets and the numbers 1-9. The letters are uppercase block in alphabets 1 and 3, and lowercase block in alphabet 2. The letters J and U are present in the first and second alphabets; the letter U is present in all alphabets. The third alphabet ends at H. All 26 letters are repeated twice in the first alphabet. Stitches: The sampler is worked in cross stitches over two threads. Condition: There is significant stitch loss. There is severe staining, particularly on the right side of the sampler. The sampler has minimal fading. The sampler is not framed.
