Description Cylindrical, glass bottle (.a) made of mold-blown, colorless (probably lead) glass. The bottle has a short neck, squared shoulders, and a shallow kick on the bottom. "HARRISON'S/ COLUMBIAN/ PERFUMERY" is printed in raised letters on one side of the bottle. The bottle was filled with white perfumed salts (.e), now stored separately. The bottle has a metal cap (.b-.d) that once fit over the neck. The cap has broken into three pieces: the top, and two strips that used to form the sides. A light brown adhesive residue is encrusted all around the neck of the bottle; it is unclear if this was part of the cap, or if it was something that once held the pieces of the cap together.
