## Title Masonic Apron

Date 1948

Primary Maker Richard Koopman

Medium Leather, linen and linen tape

Description Masonic apron made of off-white colored leather (probably kid skin)

lined with linen. The apron is rectangular in shape and the ties are each 42

inches long, and are made from linen tape that is folded over and stitched

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across the top. Coming out of the top seam is a triangular-shaped flap that is

approximately six inches long. The flap is attached to the apron at the top seam,

and can be lifted to reveal markings and inscriptions relating to George

Koopman's initiation into the Masonic Order at St. John's Lodge No. 4 in

Hartford, CT. The group's signet (a compass and square rule with a "G") appears

at the top in blue ink.
