Description Street map of New Haven, Connecticut, shows the city extending from the harbor to the south, the Mill River to the east, Sachem's Wood to the north, and West Street to the west. The Public Square or Green is in the center, and there is an inset of Fair Haven in the upper right corner. Notable landmarks include the Rope Walk, the New York & New Haven Rail Road and one station,

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the New Haven and Northampton Rail Road, the Farmington Rail Road, Union Basin and Union Wharf, a steam boat wharf and office, Yale College, and the burying ground (cemetery).
