## **Basic Detail Report**

Primary Maker Mr. Medcalfe

Medium Engraving; black printer's ink on wove paper

Description Relief map of parts of New York and Vermont, with Lake Champlain to the north, the Connecticut River to the east, Albany to the south, and Fort William to the west. Relief is conveyed with hachure marks. Routes are marked on the map with dotted and broken parallel lines, and dates that probably refer to "principal actions" are marked with Xs. Farms, mills, towns and forts are labeled. The forts include Fort William Henry/Fort George, Fort Miller, Fort Hardy, Massachusetts Fort, Fort Ticonderoga, Fort Arm, and at least one unnamed fort along Otter Creek.
