

Railroad are drawn in solid black lines, with towns on the route labeled. There

are other, smaller solid black lines that may represent connections, and double

parallel lines or broken solid lines that show the routes of other railroads. The

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other railroads listed are an unnamed railroad running between Lancaster and Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; an unnamed railroad running along a short stretch of the canal between Pittsburgh and Holidaysburg, Pennsylvania; the Erie Railroad; and an unnamed railroad between the St. Lawrence River and Belfast, Maine. State boundaries are drawn in broken solid and dotted lines, and rivers are labeled.
