

Basic Detail Report

Description Map of the city of Hartford from Spring Grove Cemetery to the north, the residence of James Dixon and Zion Hill Cemetery to the west, just beyond the Retreat for the Insane to the south, and the Connecticut River to the east. Prominently shown are the Little River or Mill River (now the Park River), Union Station, the Hartford and New Haven Railroad, the Hartford and Springfield Railroad, the Hartford, Providence and Fishkill Railroad, the steamboat dock, and other docks. The existing city limits and the proposed extension of the city limits are both shown. Vigenettes depict the Charter Oak, the (Old) State House, the Pearmain Apple Tree (brought from England by George Wyllys), and the Wadsworth Atheneum.
