

A Sanitary Sewer Legend at lower right provides a key to sewers six to twenty-three inches in diameter, sewers twenty-four inches or large in diameter, force mains, manholes, pump stations, and pump station service areas. A key to Newington streets is at upper right. Sewers to the north are tributary to the Hartford Water Pollution Control Facility. Sewers to the west and south are tributary to the Mattabessett Water Pollution Control Facility. Sewers to the east are tributary to the Rocky Hill Water Pollution Control Facility.
