Description Map of the borough of Danielsonville as it spans the towns of

Killingly and Brooklyn, Connecticut. Killingly, colored yellow, is shown from

Westfield Cemetery to the north, Broad Street to the east, the Quinebaug River

to the south, and Maple Street to the west. The Norwich and Worcester Railroad

line runs north-south through Killingly. Brooklyn, colored red, is on the other

side of the river. Danielsonville is located primarily in Killingly, near the river.

Roads are labeled and lined with residences and businesses, which are labeled

with the owner's name or the name of the business. On the left side is a directory

of Danielsonville that contains listings for attornies, agents, the bank, druggists,

physicians and dentists, merchants and dealers, a jeweler, an engineer,

manufacturers, hotels, the sheriff, milliners, carpenters and builders, painters, a

photographer, a blacksmith and a collector.
