Description Map of Hartford, Connecticut, showing the city as it appeared in the early nineteenth century. The streets are labeled and there are six circled numbers on the map that show the locations of buildings or sites important to Hartford's or Aetna Insurance Company's history: the State House, Morgan's Exchange Coffee House, Phoenix Bank, the Charter Oak, Washington College (now Trinity College), and the old burying ground. Text below the map explains Aetna's history and some of Hartford's. On the back are ten images depicting scenes celebrating Connecticut during its tercentenary year.
