

Description Map of eastern Connecticut with Suffield, Windsor, Weathersfield, Middle Town, Haddam, Durham, and Guildford on the west, Massachusetts to the north, the Colony of Rhode Island to the east, and The Sound to the South. The land is densely dotted with what appear to be small houses. References at the left provide a key to "the Original Bounds of the Pequot Country conquered by the English in 1638, since mistakenly called the Moheagan Country," "Lands decreed to the Indians by the ex parte judgment of Jos. Dudley and others in 1703," "the Tract called the sequestered Land, all disputes relative to which were settled by the Committee in 1721," and "the Tract so settled upon the

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Indians and now in their Possession called the Moheagan Fields confirmed to

them by the judgment of the last Commissioners." A scale of miles is at the lower

left. A simple compass indicating north, south, east, and west is at the lower

right.
