**Basic Detail Report** 

BE IT REMEMBERED that I, Mary O. A. Boreham, of Avon, Connecticut, in the United States of America, widow, do make and publish this Instrument to be my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all previous wills by me at any time made.

First. Whereas my sister Susan H. C. Beever has hired for a term of years Lamb House, Rye, Sussex, England, with the expectation and understanding that I would share with her in the cost of hiring and keeping up said house, so that I might live there with her at such times as I might wish to be in England, and

How, therefore, I direct my executors, in the event of my death before my said eleter, during the period for which we have now, or may hereafter have, planned the joint use of said house, to pay her such sum of money as in their judgment will fully reimburse her for the whole expense of hiring and keeping up said house until such time as she can, with convenience to herself, be relieved of the burden of so doing, it being my desire and intention that she shall be relieved of all expense in the matter.

I further direct my executors to pay all legacy. estate, inheritance, and other similar duties and taxes on the foregoing bequest out of the residue of my estate.

The foregoing provisions of my will shall be carried out in preference and priority to any legacies hereinafter given.

Second. I give to Henry C. Sheppard Kerr, of Dalkey, Ireland, the sum of Twenty thousand dollars, if he
