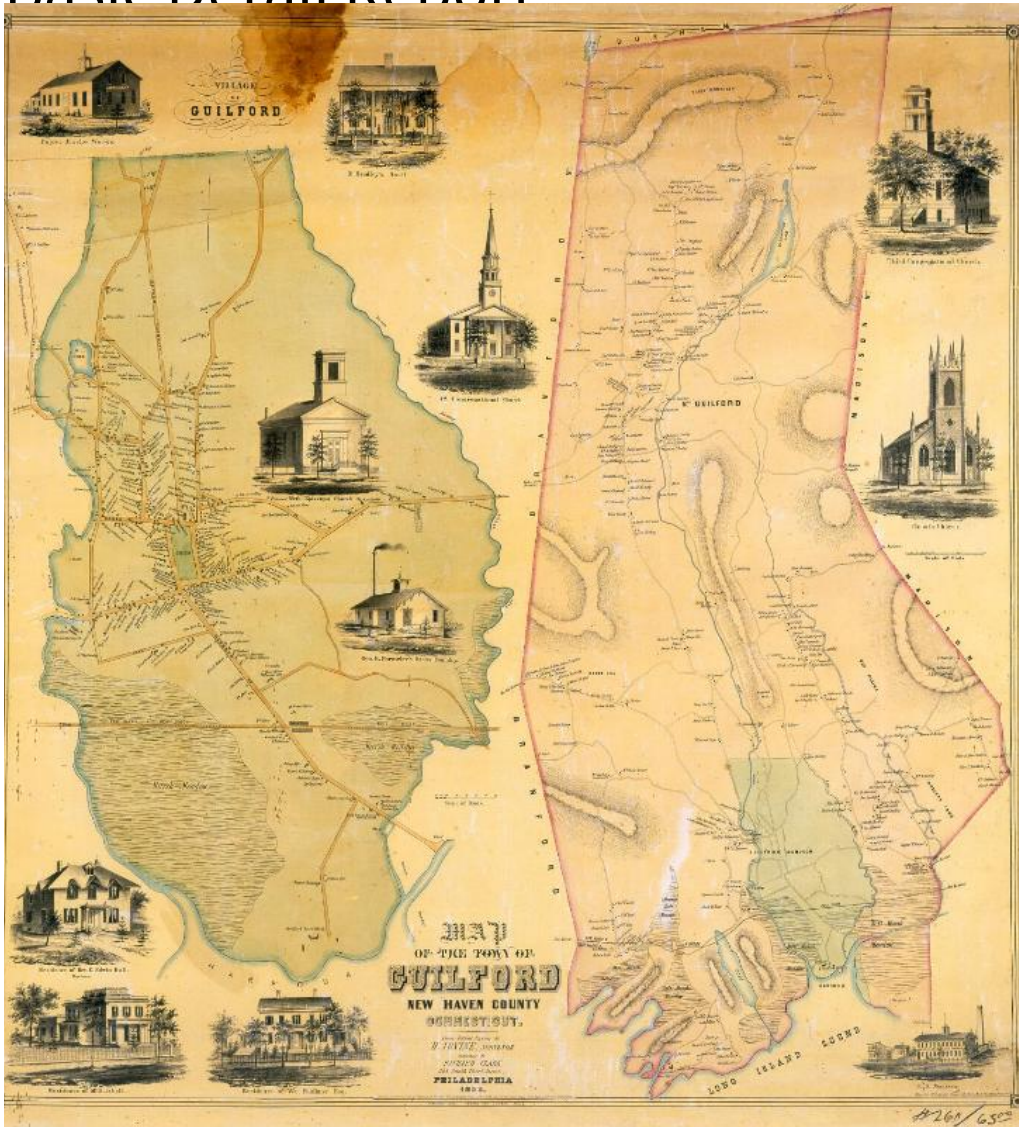

Description Map of the town of Guilford, Connecticut, with Durham on the north, North Madison and Madison on the east, Long Island Sound on the south, and Branford and North Branford on the west. Streams, lakes, ponds, and extensive salt marsh meadows are shown. Hills appear as outlines surrounded by hachure

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marks. Toket Mountain, Hungry Hill, Quennypaug Lake, Nut Plains, Dudley's

Town, Guilford Borough, and North Guilford are identified. A separate detailed

map of the village of Guilford is at the left. Streets, businesses, and houses are

shown; names of property owners appear on both maps, though the names of

property owners in Guilford village do not appear on the larger map. The New

Haven and New London Railroad appears on both maps. Vignettes depict the

Papier Mache Works, M. Bradley's Hotel, the First Congregational Church, the

Third Congregational Church, the Methodist Episcopal Church, Christ Church,

George B. Parmelee's Iron Foundry, J. S. Norton's American Lock Works, and the

residences of the Reverend E. Edwin Hall, H. Isbell, and William Faulkner.
