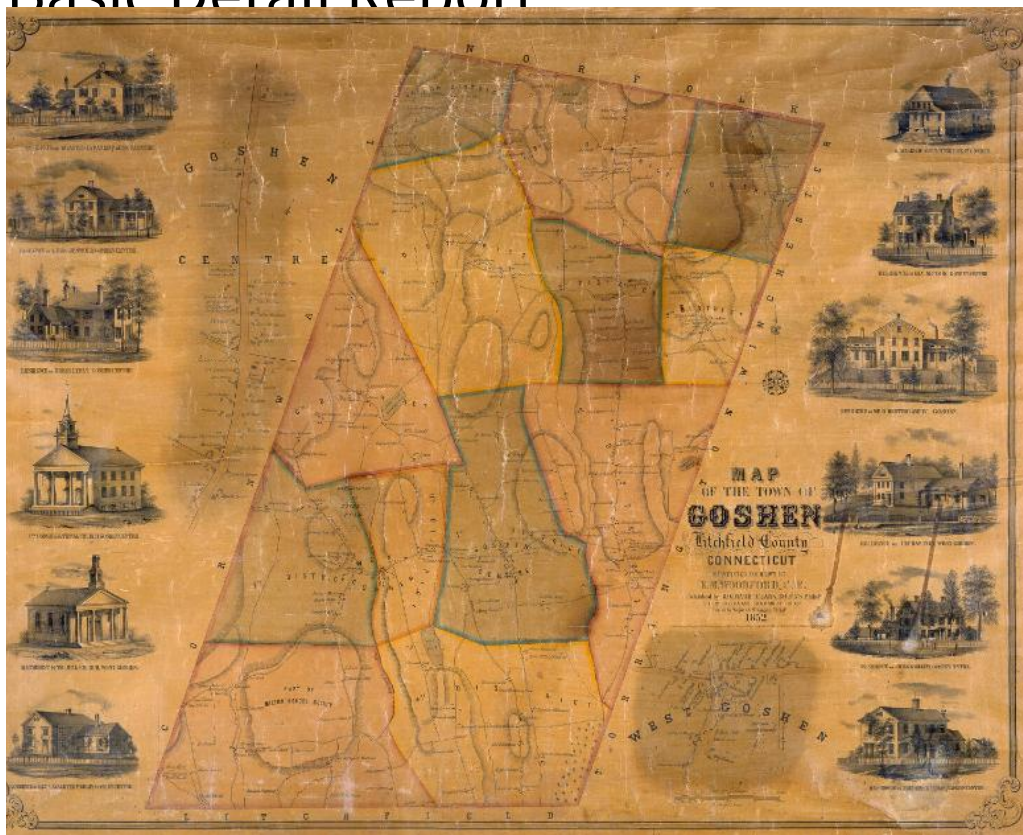

Description Map of the town of Goshen, Connecticut, with Norfolk to the north, Torrington and Winchester to the east, Litchfield to the south, and Cornwall to the west. The town is divided into twelve school districts but only ten districts are numbered. Roads, including the Sharon Turnpike and turnpike gate, streams, ponds, and hills are shown. Elevation is indicated by hachure marks. Names of property owners are indicated. Separate inset maps provide additional detail for Goshen Centre and West Goshen. Vignettes at left and right depict the first

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Congregational Church, the Methodist Episcopal Church, A. Miles and Son's

Store, and the residences of the Reverend Lavalette Perrin, Moses Lyman, Giles

Griswold, Erastus Lyman, General M. Cook, Milo Bartholomew, Cephus Ives,

Cicero Collins, and Frederick Lyman.
