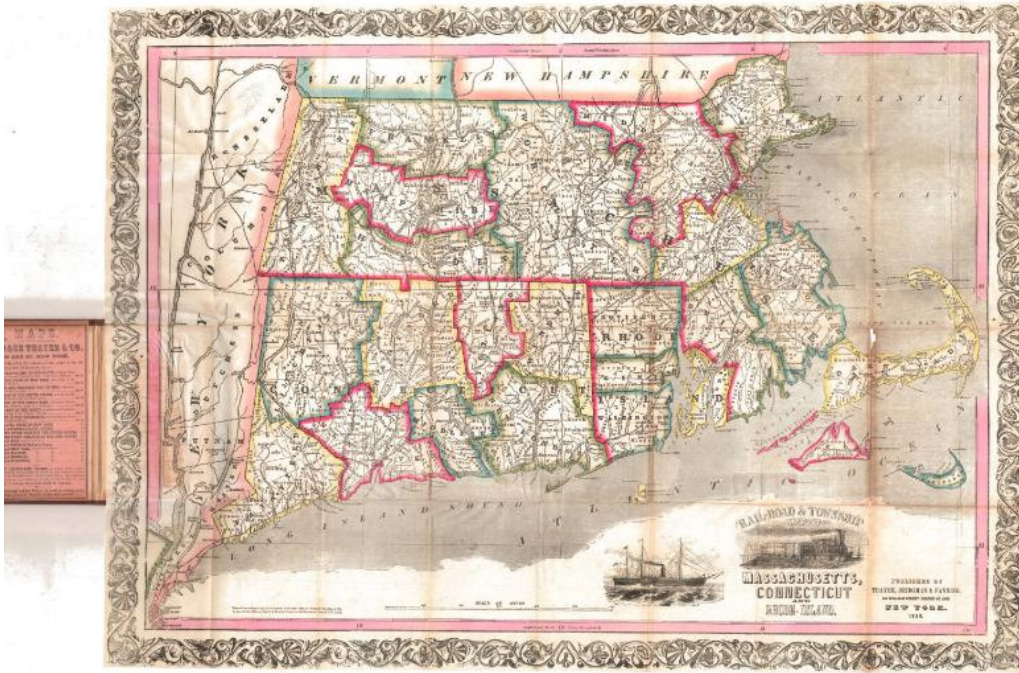

Description Pocket map of Massachusetts, Connecticut and Rhode Island, with the borders of Vermont and New Hampshire to the north, the Atlantic Ocean to the east, the Long Island Sound to the south, and New York state to the west.

The states are divided into counties, outlined in blue, red, green, or yellow, and subdivided into towns. Railroad lines are prominently depicted, although they are not labeled. Cities are indicated with groups of black squares. Physical

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features depicted include elevation, conveyed with hachure marks, rivers and

lakes. The decorative cartouche shows a train with a town in the background. To

the left of this is a vignette of a large steamboat.
