**Description** Map of Massachusetts, Connecticut, and Rhode Island, with Vermont, New Hampshire, and Maine to the north, the Atlantic Ocean to the east, Long Island Sound and part of Long Island to the south, and New York State to the west. Counties are shown in different colors and the same colors are used to outline the townships within each county. Many hills, mountains, rivers, streams and other geographical features are shown and named. Elevation is indicated by hachure marks. Railroads, steamship lines and mailboat routes are clearly shown, but highways and other roads are not included. A small map of the United States showing political divisions is at lower right. Tables list travel distances between major cities; counties and county seats; and population in each census between 1800 and 1900. An index to cities and towns is at upper right with coordinates corresponding to letters in the upper and lower margins and numbers in the left and right margins.
