Description Map of Saybrook, West Saybrook and Old Lyme, Connecticut, and the surrounding area, from Chester and Lyme to the north, East Lyme to the east, the Long Island Sound to the south, and Clinton to the west. Colors, lines and symbols are used to denote stratified drift, rock outcroppings, elevation, woods, ground water, dug or driven wells, drilled wells, and springs. There are numbers next to the wells and springs that correspond to numbers used in tables (not provided). Blue is used to denote water, including rivers, reservoirs, lakes and ponds. Local roads are depicted, with black squares probably representing buildings. The Valley Division and the Shore Line Division of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad run through the area.
