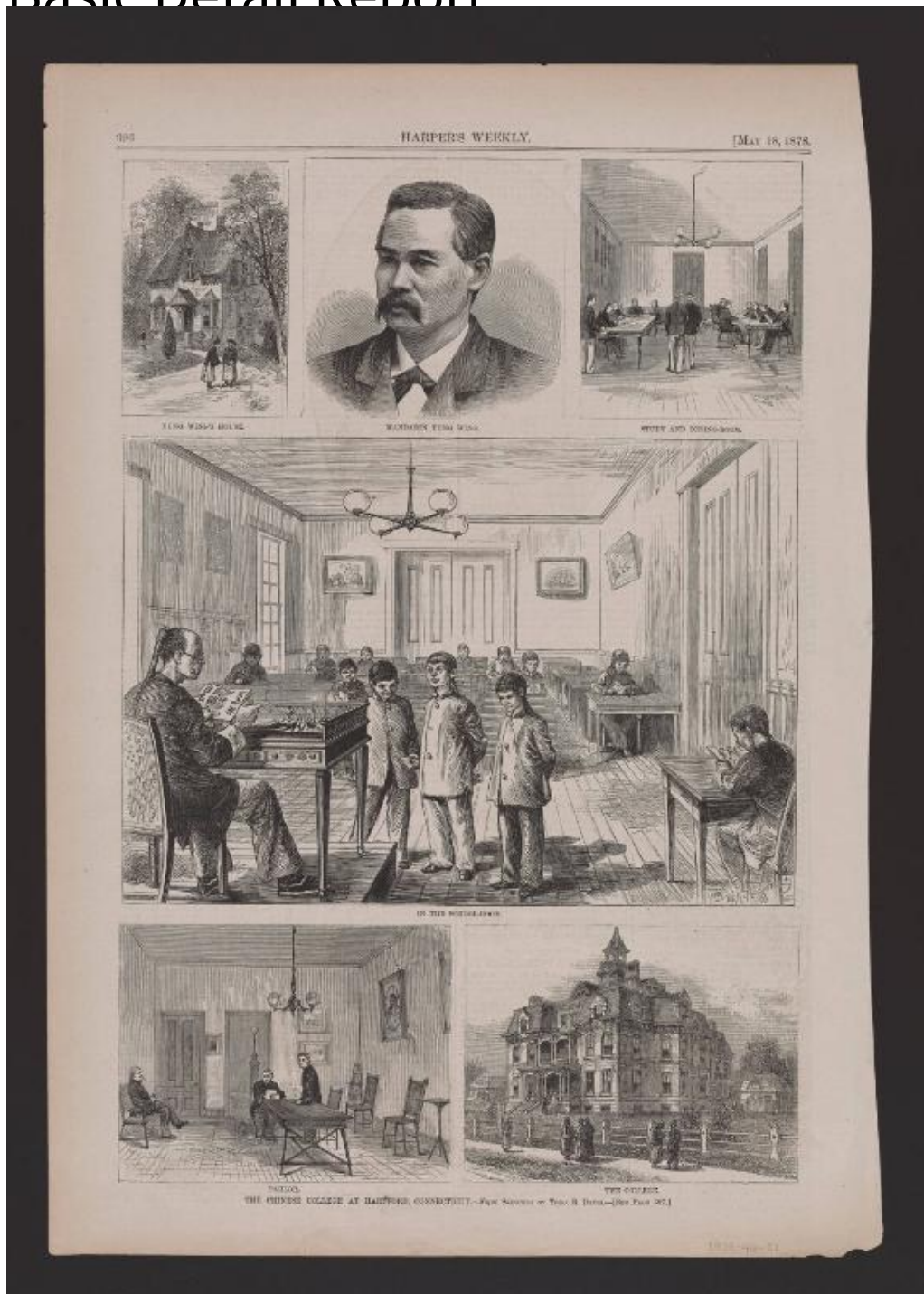

# Basic Detail Report

Description Wood-engraved illustration from Harper's Weekly, May 18, 1878. The

Chinese Educational Mission was a program sponsored by the Chinese

government to enable Chinese students to obtain training in western science,

technology and military affairs. .21a - Two-story center gabled house

surrounded by trees. Two men who appear to be in Chinese dress stand in the

driveway. .21b - Portrait of a Chinese man, Yung Wing, with a mustache. He is

wearing a jacket. .21c - Interior of a room with several men, some of whom

appear to be Chinese. Two men have long queues or braids. Some sit at tables. A

gas light fixture hangs from the ceiling. .21d - Several Chinese boys are seated at

desks or standing. A Chinese man with a long queue or braid and wearing

eyeglasses sits at a desk with a book that appears to be written in Chinese.

Framed pictures are on the wall. A gas light fixture hangs from the ceiling. .21e -

Three Chinese men in an interior. Two have mustaches or beards. A table and

chairs are in the room. Framed pictures are on the walls. A gas light fixture hangs

from the ceiling. .21f - Three-story Second Empire building with a mansard roof

and cupola. People are on the porch and steps. The building in the background

is probably a carriage house or barn. Several men, some of whom appear to be

Chinese, are on the sidewalk. Trees are in the yard.
