Description Photographs taken on November 16, 2011, of the Bosnian weavings in the exhibition "Rugs of Remembrance: Bosnian Weaving in Hartford" on display at the Institute for Community Research. (.1) Image of a large woven carpet made by Fikreta Muratovic on display in the Institute for Community Research gallery. This ilim is 9 feet by 12 feet, woven with cotton/linen warp and wool weft. Fikreta made this exactly like one she had woven in Bosnia when she worked with Bosfam, a cultural organization that employed weavers as a way to market ilimi, support women artists, and maintain traditional weaving after the war. The large loom needed for this ilim was made by her father, Bajro Vejzovic.
