

Title Teapot in Wicker Basket

Date 1870-1900

Primary Maker Yung Kwai

Medium porcelain; wicker; brass; cotton

Description A teapot (a) with a lid (b) in a wicker basket (c) originally belonging to Yung Kwai and given by him to the Vaille family as a gift. The Vaille family was Yung Kwai's host family during the Chinese Educational Mission. (a-b) The teapot is decorated with scenes of flowers, birds, butterflies, and a group of Asian people in a building. It has a wire handle wrapped in red twine. (c) The interior of the wicker basket is lined with tan and red padding. It has a brass closure on the front and two handles on top.
