Piersall, 39, only two years removed from rearning the outfield for the California Angels, still remains in playing shape at six feet, 185 pounds. The determination that made him a major league star for fifteen years is still quite eminent. This writer can attest to his boundless energy and enthusiasm from a recent telephone conversation.

Jim is equally determined to be a success in his new position with the Buckskins. The obvious question, though, was why football and what do you know about the sport? At a recent ACFL meeting in New York, Jim stated, "I know as much about football as many baseball men know about baseball. I'm positive I can make a living at it. I'll work hard to sell a quality product—and that's what we have here. It'll be

casy to sell," Jim added, Jim also stated that Roanoke will be playing in a 25,000seat ballpark and the important factor is that the league is stable. Jim did some research on the league and learned that in three years the attendance has grown to 235,000.

All this is really nothing new to Piersall. He worked in sales promotion for ten years in Boston. He also spent the last two years as a publicity man with the Angels. Thus, the Roanoke franchise, affiliated with the Washington Redskins of the NFL, have inherited a rather studious individual. Jim has done his homework well as he reports the sale of 2500 season tickets in the few weeks he has been on the job.

Jim also mentioned that the Hartford Knights 1968 Highlight Film has been very instrumental in gaining support from local businessmen in the Boanoke area. He uses this film at speaking engagements and considers it a valuable public relations tool. Indicative of this is at one of Jim's recent speaking engagements, a local merchant came up to Jim and purchased forty season tickets and stated that the Highlight Film had sold him on the Atlantic Coast Football League.
