Description Photograph of Center Congregational Church and adjoining

buildings, Main Street, Hartford. The church and nearby commercial buildings

are seen from an elevated viewpoint, probably a rooftop. The church has a

steeple with a clock and a pediment supported by Ionic columns. Signs on

stores read: "223 Seyms & Co. 223", "Watches and Jewelry", and "Henry Lewith."

Some businesses have awnings. Light snow is on the paved sidewalk. A horse-

drawn vehicle is in the street in the foreground. Inscribed on back: "The

buildings on the left of the Center Church / standing between that building &

Gold Street / were formerly occupied by Humphrey Seyms / and James L.

Howard & Co. The buildings were / destroyed about 1898 to increase the width

of Gold Street."
