"WAYSIDE CHOSS" WAR MENTORIAL TO MEN CAMARN'S HERCES.

This adaptation of the amoient granch and English wayside crosses, has been eracted on the green at New Canasa, Ct., in memory of the men and wemen who served their country in America 's five great wars, a series of sculptured allegarical panels representing each of the wars. I The shaft is of travertine—the stope used in building Reme—imported from Italy, 17 feet high, and bears a dedicatory inscription on the base as follows:

"Dedicated to the Glory of the Almighty God in memory of new Canasan Men and Wiman who by their unselfish patriotism have advanced the great American ideals of liberty

and the brotherhood of man" General O'Ryan of New York was crater at the dedicatio and Harry Bates Thayer, Pres. of the A. T & T, was chairman of the memorial committee.

The cross was designed by Putnem Brindley, W Frank Purdy, and Ernest S Leland, of New Canaan's famus art octony, collaborating with Frances Adams Kent, the sculptor, and was carved in the Prosbrey-Leland studies.
