Medium Hand-stitched painted silk damask, silk tape, wood, and leather

Description Women's shoes made of the remains of a military standard, or flag,
of red silk damask, painted in gold and black. The remnants of the painted
design show letters on a banner: "OIT" on one shoe, and an "N" on the other,
along with decorative swirls. The shoes have a pointed oval toe and a small
Louis heel, covered in white silk damask. The leather sole is continuous over the
front of the heel. Two latchets crossing the vamp of the shoe would have
buckled. The silk is lined with plain-woven linen, as is the inside of the sole. The
silk is bound with cream-colored silk tape, which is mostly missing--revealing a
hastily whipstitched edge. The tongue is pointed and the side seam is straight.
