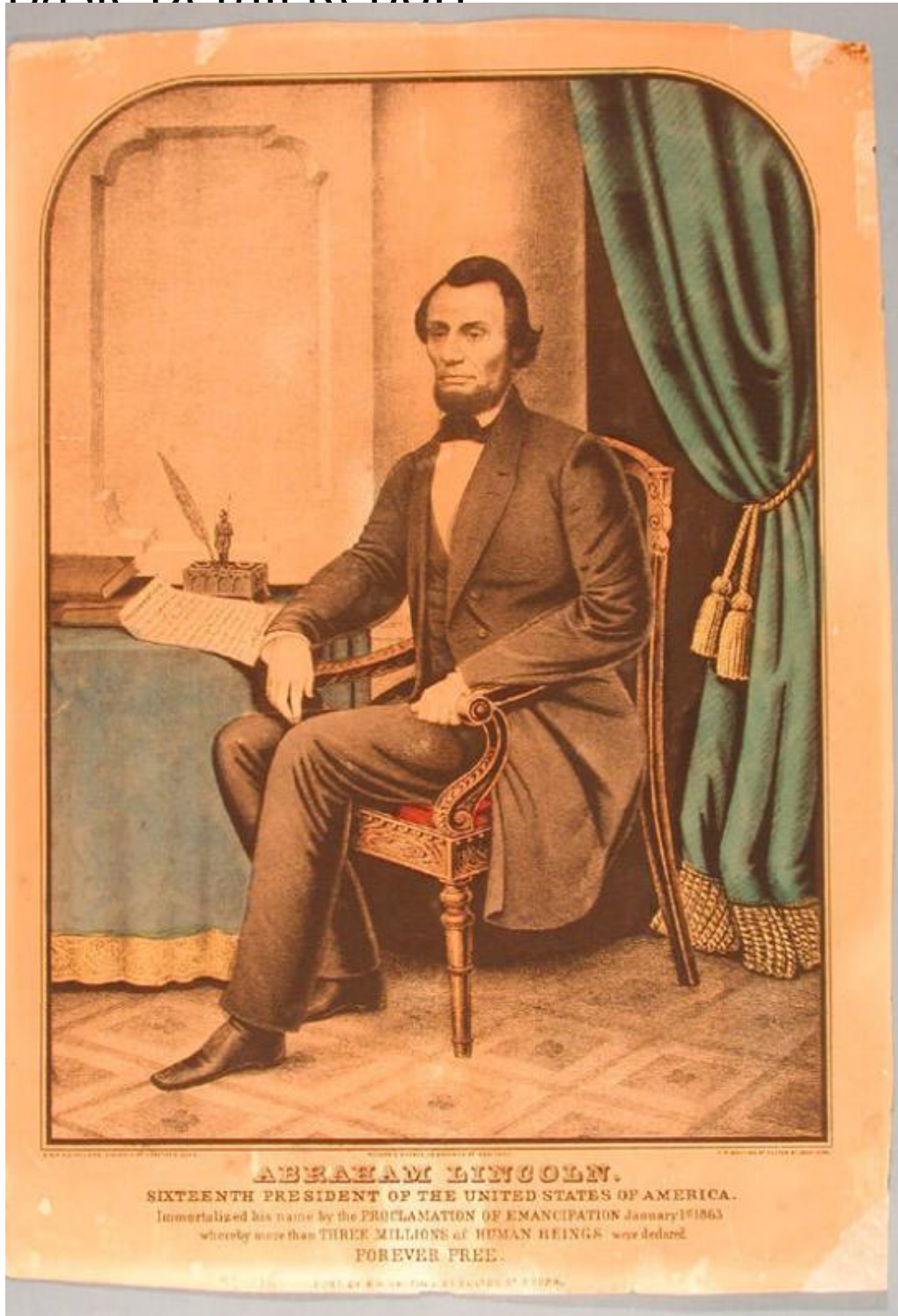


Basic Detail Report
