Medium Mechanically-molded ironstone with underglaze cobalt blue decoration Description Round, ironstone plate with a transfer-printed pattern and border in a light underglaze cobalt blue. The pattern is surrounded by a border that covers the entire lightly-ribbed rim. The border consists of garlands of intertwined flowers and leaves. There are light scratches on the surface of the plate and crazing on many surfaces. There is a chip in the foot of the plate.
