

Title Figured Flasks

## **Basic Detail Report**

Medium Mold-blown amber glass

Description Pair of figured flasks made of mold-blown amber glass. The flasks each have an inverted conical collar at the rim, a cylindrical neck, rounded shoulders and tapered sides, a flattened body, and a flat bottom. Both sides of each flask have raised decorations. One side of each flask has the arched word "TRAVELER's" over an eight-pointed, rounded star. Below this is the word "COMPANION". On the opposite side of each flask is a sheaf of grain or wheat, bound in the middle, with stalks curving to the left and right. Beneath and below the sheaf are a small crossed rake and a pitchfork. The bottom of flask .1 has an oval ring of light scratches and wear around the edge.

Dimensions Primary Dimensions (height x width x depth of each flask):  $9 \times 4 \frac{1}{2} \times 2 \frac{1}{2}$  in. (22.9 x 11.4 x 6.4cm)
