## Title "Elm Hills Golf" Game

Description Boxed board game for playing golf. The cover (.g) of the box is printed in green, white, and red. over his right shoulder. The game board (.a) is printed in green, white, and black.

It depicts a man teeing off in the lower left corner, and a large white building in

the lower right corner. The building has a flag flying over it that reads, "ELM

HILLS". In the middle and on the top are numbers and spaces for moving pieces.

The score pad (.b) has a grid to score nine holes of golf. There are two slots each

for Team A and Team B. The remainder of the game consists of: an envelope (.d)

containing eight game pieces shaped like golf tees (two purple, two yellow, two

light blue, and two red) and two white and purple dice; and two red paper

cylinders (.e and .f) that are each closed at one end, possibly used to shake the

dice.
