On the right, a man dressed as a puritan is reading from an open book. His conical black hat is on the wall behind him. In front of him, a dead cat is hanging from a tree branch by its neck. A paper in a bowl in the foreground is inscribed "Cromwell / Inn / Banbury / Bill / of / Fare". The name "Roeste" is inscribed on the wall in the left foreground.
