The Farms

Hopkins Vineyard - The only vineyard in Connecticut influenced by an inland lake; which extends their growing season for varieties not normally suited for this state. Both rides will finish at Hopkins Vineyard with

wine tasting.

Averill Farm – This historic 9th generation farm sits on a scenic hilltop. Visit the farm stand for fruit, honey, flowers, cider, maple syrup, pumpkins, gourds and

Starberry Farm - This farm stand features cherries, Starberry Farm – In its farm stand retauries cherries, peaches, nectrines, plans, a pricoses, blueberries, honey, pies, breads, jellies, jams, and apple gift boxes. Klimberry Farms – Visit this farm stand for fresh tomatoes, sweet corn, pumpkins, and other produce. This 3th generation farm milks 70 Holstein & Ayrshires and has been milking since 1955.

Harris Hill Farm – This picturesque farm has a seasonal selection of produce to include pumpkins, gourds, and mums.

Cortina Gardens – This stop includes a variety of nursery items such as perennials, annuals, shrubs, hanging baskets, gifts, coment and terracotta pots.

New Milford Farmers' Market – New Milford Town

White Silo Farm – Take a self guided tour of this 18th century barn or pick your own red, yellow, and orange raspberries and browse the farm stand for specialty

items.

Fieldstone Nursery – This seasonal nursery offers unusual varieties of annuals, perennials (shade, ornamental, and evergreens), and pumpkins.

Sullivan Farm - This chemical free 126 acre farm is

Hunt Hill Parm - This combination of two historic farms is listed on the National Register of Historic Places; is an Affiliate of the Smithsonian Institution; and home to the Silo Gallery, Store & Cooking School, Visit the newly opened Skitch Henderson Living

Aspetuck Gardens – Family owned and operated for 35 years, this nursery offers a large selection of shrubs; unusual annuals & perennials; in addition to cut flowers, jellies, and jams.
