wool weft. Fikreta made this exactly like one she had woven in Bosnia when she

worked with Bosfam, a cultural organization that employed weavers as a way to

market ilimi, support women artists, and maintain traditional weaving after the

war. The large loom needed for this ilim was made by her father, Bajro Vejzovic.
