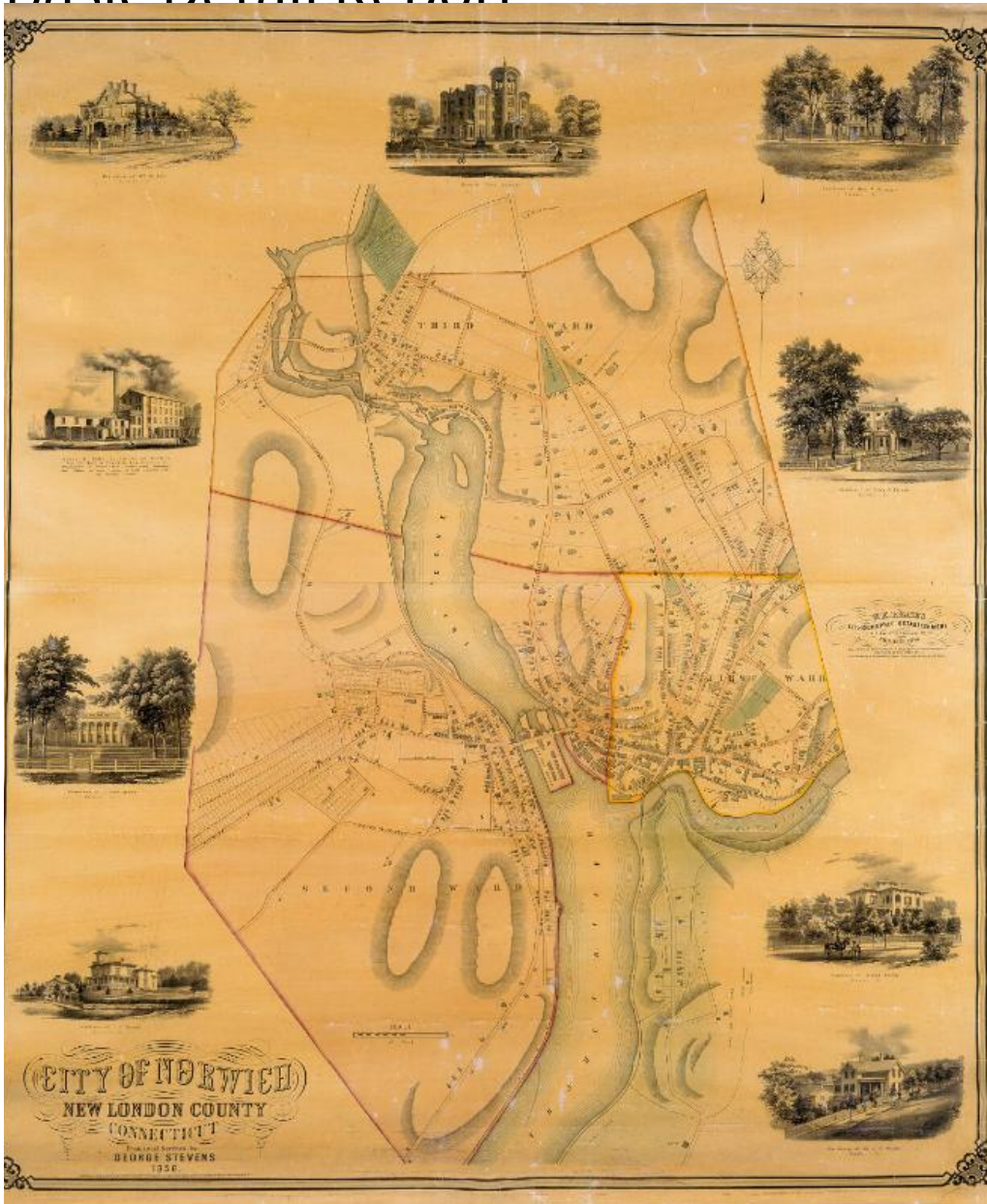


# Basic Detail Report

Description Map of the city of Norwich, Connecticut, located on the Thames

River at the confluence of the Yantic and Shetucket Rivers. Several bridges span

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the rivers. A large body of water above the Central Wharf and below Yantic Falls

is identified as the Cove. The locations of several springs are shown. The city is

divided into three wards. Streets are identified and houses and buildings are

identified by street number. The New London, Willimantic and Palmer Railroad

runs along the west bank of the Thames; the Norwich and Worcester Railroad

runs along the right bank. Cemeteries, churches, parks, and some businesses are

identified, including the town poor house, a ropewalk, a papermill, a gristmill, a

coal yard, H. Bill's Laurel Hill Farm, and the Falls Manufacturing Company.

Vignettes at the left, top, and right of the map depict the Norwich Free Academy,

the premises of Myers and Bailey, Architects and Builders, and the residences of

C. C. Brand, J. Hunt Adams, William W. Coit, Joseph Backus, Dr. J. V. Wilson,

Charles N. Farnum, and General W. Williams.
