Medium Mechanically-molded ironstone with underglaze cobalt blue decoration

Description Round, ironstone plate with a transfer-printed underglaze cobalt blue pattern and border. The circular pattern, printed in the center of the plate, is titled, "OLIVER & ABIGAIL (WOLCOTT) ELLSWORTH". The scene shows an older gentleman and woman, wearing eighteenth-century clothing, seated inside a room in front of a window. There are several shelves of books to the left, and a curtain is drawn away to the right of the window.
