Description Side-by-side maps of Higganum and Haddam, Connecticut.

Higganum is oriented east-west on the sheet. None of the roads are labeled with the exception of the turnpike road. Owned lots of land are depicted, with rectangular shapes indicating buildings. These are labeled with the owner or occupant's name. The Connecticut Valley Railroad line is visible at the bottom right of the map. A cemetery, school, park, and two churches are colored green.

On the right side of the sheet is the map of another portion of the town of

Haddam, including the villages of Haddam and Shailorsville, with the

Connecticut River to the east. The Connecticut Valley Railroad runs parallel to
