- 2:15 Band begins to play
- 2:45 Mrs. Auerbach welcomes students to Connecticut (standing microphone on stage)  
Mrs. Auerbach introduces Mrs. Tyler
- 2:50 Mrs. Tyler welcomes students to Service Bureau weekend (at standing mike)  
Mrs. Tyler introduces The Rockwell Rockets (see attached card)
- 2:55 Band plays two numbers--Tea for Two Medley and Harvest Moon
- 3:05 Mrs. Tyler introduces Dr. Feldman (See attached card)  
Dr. Feldman speaks
- 3:20 Carollers go to stage  
Mrs. Tyler introduces The Carollers of the University of Connecticut and their leader, Mr. Sylvester Schmitz, for a medley of songs (Carollers stay on stage at end of medley)
- 3:40 Mrs. Tyler introduces the hostess chairmen, pointing out that each has worked with a committee:
- Mrs. Charles Ritch, Hartford Council of Church Women, in charge of the buffet luncheons Museum)
  - Mrs. William Ames, Mystic and New London areas (also works at Marine/
  - Mrs. Charles Alexander, Yale and New Haven areas (160 students plus full-time job)
  - Mrs. Morton Briggs, Middletown (busy mother, entertains all Wesleyan foreign students for tea to start plans for weekend)
  - Mrs. Paul Browne, West Hartford (an elementary school teacher, has arranged for hospitality for 60 students from Hartford area, Yale, UConn, Litchfield County--all during the course of a bad cold)
  - Mrs. Frank Gray, Middlobury (a new chairman this year, has placed many Yale students in the Waterbury area)
  - Mrs. Alanson Harper, Fairfield (although holding an important full time job, Mrs. Harper has arranged hospitality for all students in the Bridgeport area)
  - Mrs. Philip Holway, Coventry (an active volunteer worker at a local hospital, Mrs. Holway delayed moving into a new house for two weeks in order to arrange hospitality for students at the University of Connecticut and Amhurst College)
- 3:45 Mrs. Tyler reassures students and hostesses who have not found each other. She asks them to go to the information desk (points it out near entrance of hall) after we sing the song closing the program. Both hostesses and students who go to the desk should note the number of the table at which they are sitting. Table numbers are shown on blue cards on each table. Please do not take the cards to the information desk with you.
- Mrs. Tyler reads countries represented asking students to stand as name of their country is read. Students' nationalities have been listed as they themselves indicated on their cards.
- Mrs. Tyler tells about "America the Beautiful." Words for song are attached to each program. Carollers and pianist go through the first stanza to familiarize group with song. Then everyone sings entire song.
- 4:55 Refreshments and dancing. Band begins to play.
- 4:50 Band stops playing.
