Description City map of Hartford, Connecticut, as it appeared in 1850. The area depicted extends from Pleasant Street on the north, the Connecticut River on the east, South Park and Jefferson Street on the south, and Cooper Lane to the west. The city appears to have been divided into 12 sections, possibly wards, labeled with numbers. Buildings are shaded in diagonal lines, and the names of streets, property owners, businesses and institutions are provided. The Little, Mill, or Park River runs east-west through the lower half of the city. Notable landmarks include Union Station, the State House, Trinity College, and Orphans Asylum. In the upper right corner, the Hartford, New Haven and Springfield Branch to the freight house (presumably associated with the railroad).
