Description Photographs of Bosnian ilimi (carpets/rugs/weavings) made by Hartford Bosnian artists during 2010-early 2011, as part of the Connecticut Cultural Heritage Arts Program's Sewing Circle Project. (.1) Image of several Bosnian weavings displayed in Hartford. (.2-.3) Images of a weaving made by Fatima Vejzovic. (.4-.5) Images of an arm chair cover woven by Fatima Vejzovic. (.6-.7) Images of weavings being made on a loom at Fatima Vejzovic's house. (.8-.9) Images of a ilim made by Ajsa Guster. (.10-.12) Images of woven Bosnian rugs made from Clatter Ridge Shetland sheep wool by several Hartford Bosnian weavers. (.13) Image of Anne Foss and Bobbie Emery, owners of Clatter Ridge Farm who manage the Shetland sheep that produce wool used by the Bosnian weavers, holding a weaving made from their sheep. The photo was taken in the Institute for Community Research Gallery. (.14-.16) Images of woven Bosnian rugs made from Clatter Ridge Shetland sheep wool.
