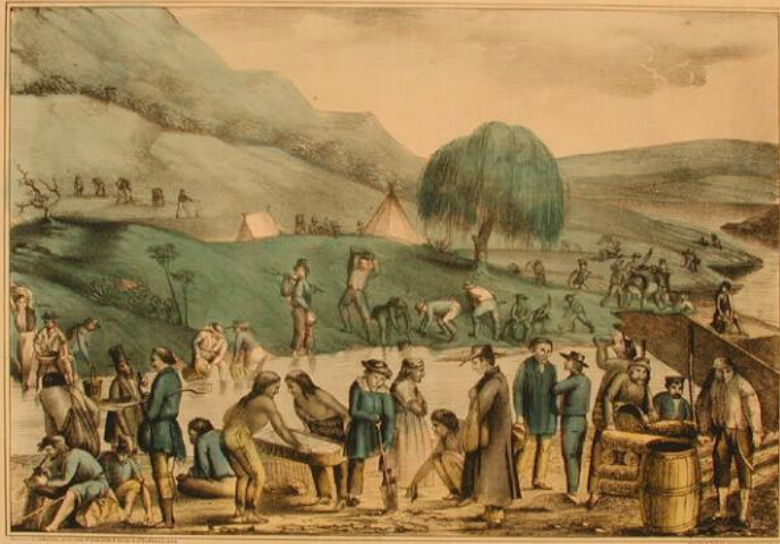


Basic Detail Report

Some use buckets or baskets. A man with a pick ax stands beside a barrel in the right foreground. A tent and a teepee are on a rise in the middle ground near a willow tree.
