 sleep aids, like cushions . . . fruit juice
 . . . water . . . and paper cups.

IDEA #8
 If you are driving in hilly country, look to
 the summit you are approaching. Have
 each rider estimate how far away it is—
 how many miles or miles and tenths.
 Check the distance on the odometer.
 Closest estimate wins.

IDEA #7
 Play "Mental Hide and Seek." Hiding
 and seeking are done in the minds of the
 players. The person hiding assumes any
 shape he wishes. Then, by questioning,
 the players seek him out. Hider: "I'm the
 size of a golf ball." Questioner: "Are you
 in the front of the car?" "Are you in the
 lower portion?" Turns out he's under the
